### The Day the Crayons Quit

Author: Drew Daywalt & Oliver Jeffers (Illus.)

### Monday: Listen to the story

### Prepare for Reading:

- Ask your child: What is your favourite crayon colour? Why? What do you like to draw?
- 2. Read the title to your child and discuss the meaning of the word 'quit' (to give up, stop, leave). Ask your child: Why do you think the crayons want to quit? What do you think the crayons want to quit doing?

### Read/Watch:

Read or watch the story. Enjoy the whole story without interruption. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=489micE6eHU

### After listening to the story:

Ask your child to summarise the story. Can they tell you about the beginning? The middle? The end? Discuss your child's prediction.

### Mathematics

FOCUS: VOLUME AND CAPACITY



- \* Learning Intention: I can estimate, measure and record the volume of containers using uniform informal units.
- \* Success criteria: Use uniform informal units to measure volume of containers.

### Activities:

- Discuss that capacity is the amount that an object can contain. For example, a bottle of soft drink may have a capacity of 600mL.
- Choose an informal unit that you can use to measure the amount of water an object hold. This informal unit might be a measuring cup, a ladle or small container.
- Use the informal unit to measure the capacity of a cup, a bowl, a teacup and a
  jar. Record your answers on the 'Comparing Capacity Using Informal Units'
  sheet.

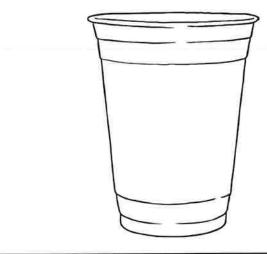

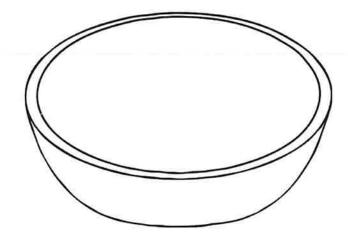

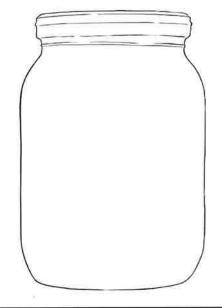

### Text Study: 'The Day the Crayons Quit':

### Tuesday: Listen to the story again and teach three new words

### Read/Watch the story again:

During the story, pause to ask these questions and define three interesting words (in bold):

- 1. Why is Red Crayon unhappy?
- What word does Purple Crayon use to describe his colour? Explain what the word 'gorgeous' means: very beautiful or lovely. What do you notice about Purple Crayon's letter? How does this fit in with his argument?
- 3. How would you solve Grey Crayon's problem?
- 4. What is Black Crayon sick of being used for?
- 5. What does Green Crayon want to congratulate Duncan for? How is Green Crayon's letter different from the other letters?
  Explain what the word 'congratulate' means: to praise someone for doing well.
- What does Yellow Crayon say to prove he is the colour of the sun?
   Explain what the word 'prove' means: to show that something is real or correct.
- 7. In their letters, the crayons ask Duncan to change something. How does the picture at the end show that he has listened?

### After listening to the story:

Write the three interesting words down (make them large) and ask your child to add them to a 'Word Wall' area in your home. Remind your child what the words mean again and how they were used in the story.

Children are not expected to be able to read these words themselves.

- Learning intention: I will write a creative text based on a visual prompt.
- Success criteria:
  - I can use Super Sentences to write an imaginative text.
  - I can write a story that includes a beginning, middle and end.

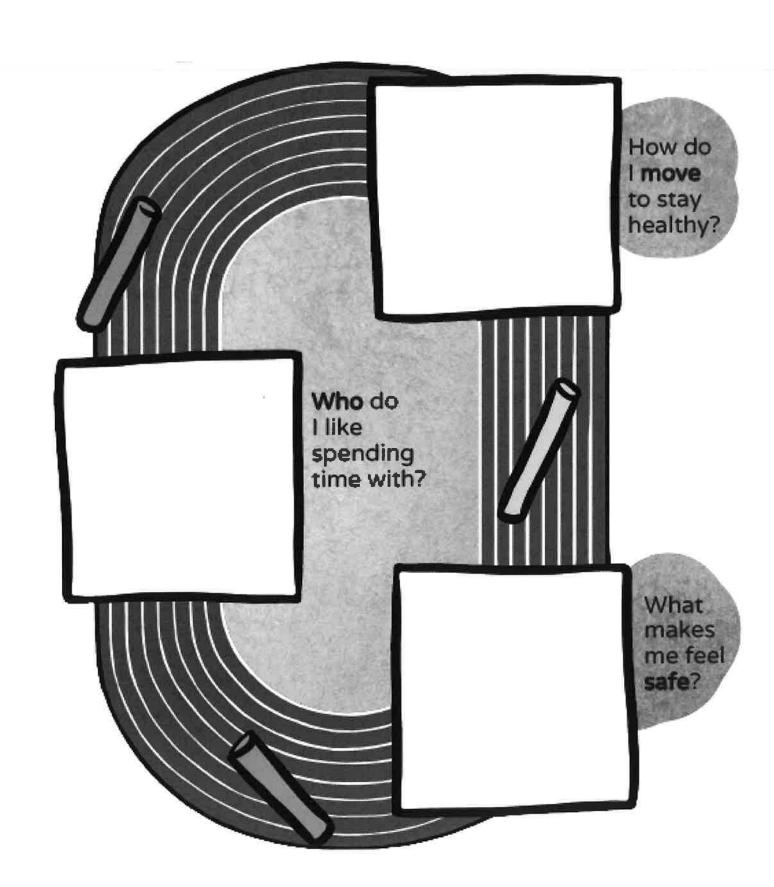

### Text Study: 'The Day the Crayons Quit': Wednesday: Talk about the words Act and Say: Look at the three words on your Word Wall at home. Talk about the meanings. Ask your child to act out each word, and then use it in a sentence as follows: 1. Pretend that you are gazing at a gorgeous painting on the wall. Say: "What a gorgeous painting!" 2. Go and congratulate a household member on being a good \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ (e.g., sister, brother). Say: "Congratulations, I think you are doing a great job at \_\_\_\_\_\_ during lockdown." 3. Pretend your are a detective who has worked out who stole a diamond ring from a jewellery shop. You have just found the fingerprints! Say: "Ah-ha! It was you and I can prove it!" During the day or week: Try to find opportunities to use the three special words in different contexts during the day (e.g., while cooking, playing outside, going for a walk). Point out the word to your child.

- Learning intention: I will write a creative text based on a visual prompt.
- Success criteria:
  - o I can use Super Sentences to write an imaginative text.

Notice and praise your child if they use one of the words on their own. Discuss the context.

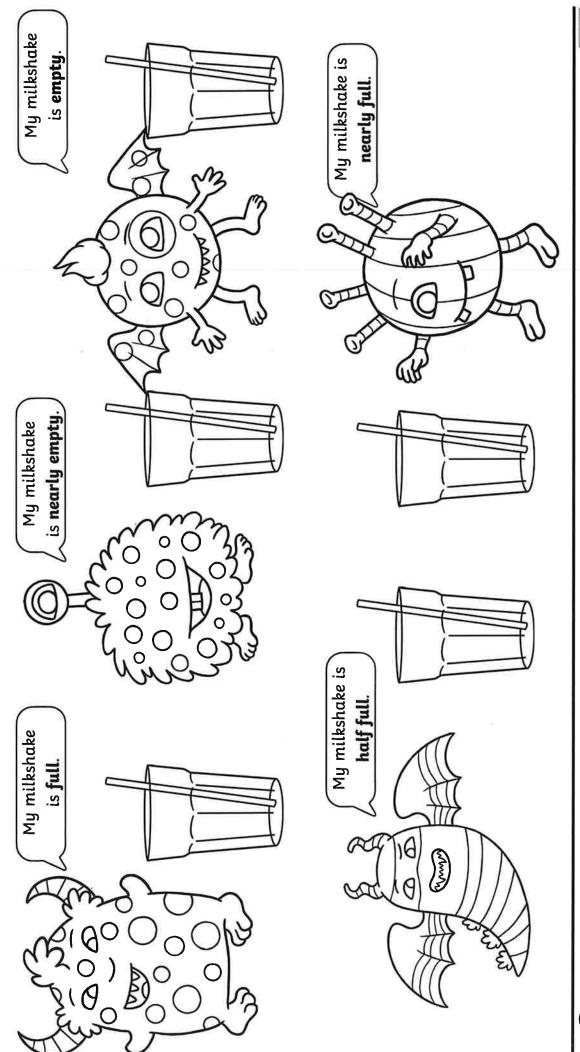

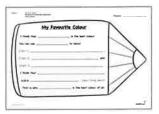
Text Study: 'The Day the Crayons Quit':

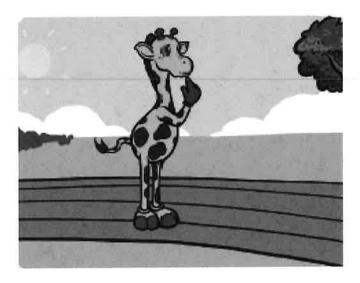

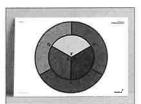

### Text Study: 'The Day the Crayons Quit':

### Friday Fun (if you wish)



Materials: Colour wheel template; paints (red, blue, yellow) or coloured pencils/crayons

Explain to your child that there are three *primary colours* (red, blue, yellow). Ask them to paint the inside of their templates with the three primary colours. Ask your child to predict what colour they will make by mixing red and yellow, blue and yellow, blue and red. Your child can then mix paints and complete the outer wheel of their template. These are the *secondary colours*. (If you do not have paints available, your child can use crayons or pencils to complete the template.)

Say: Look at your **gorgeous** colour wheel. You have **proved** what happens when you mix primary colours together. **Congratulations** on your lovely work!
